After 37+ years of working in the Water and Wastewater Industry, William (Bill) D. Culligan has decided to ride off into the sunset of his career (on his Harley). It's very hard to sum up everything one accomplishes in a short article like this so I would like to share some of the highlights with you if I may.

Bill started in October of 1979 at the Village of Monticello's Wastewater Plant as a maintenance worker. He quickly became a Certified Wastewater Treatment Operator for their 3.1 million gallon per day (MGD) Activated Sludge Plant and in 1985 became their Chief Plant Operator.

In April of 1990, he took a position in the Town of Thompson Water and Wastewater Department as their Assistant Superintendent. He was promoted to the Superintendent position in 1994. In 1999, they added yet another responsibility to his list when they made him the Superintendent of the Town's Parks and Recreation Department. He holds these titles as of this writing and will pass the torch on them with his retirement. His responsibilities include:
