



INTRODUCTION

In 1992, the village was awarded a grant to upgrade and extend the distribution of water, in which I was a part of. This provided me an early introduction into a public water system and how it works. In 2002, I was transferred to the Village of Albion Water Treatment Plant as an operator trainee in using chemicals to treat water. The chemicals used in the process were chlorine dioxide, pac and fluoride to treat the surface water. The system served nearly 10,000 customers in the 7 different municipalities.

It was there that I had finally found my passion for water, which had similarities to the dairy farm I held close to my heart. The power of water is fascinating to me, and what I have learned over the years has given me a greater appreciation of it. In 2008, the Village of Albion appointed me as their Chief Water Treatment Plant Operator, over the years I obtained the 1A, D, and C certifications in the water industry.

For nearly 30 years, I have experienced many water challenges within the system, which will provide me with the resources I need to assist in keeping our community water systems safe.
